Plaques and flyers, cyber insurance for credit and debit card use, also a startup cost estimate fir the Hot Rod Café. There was a quorum, meeting was adjourned 7:30p

MEMBERS MEETING

President Ferron called the meeting to order at 7:30pm, a quorum of 18 members were present. After the pledge of allegiance and club prayer, the recording secretary and treasurers report was read. Both were approved by the membership. Topics discussed at the board meting was presented to the membership. Our insurance company has agreed to sponsor this year's cruise nights giving us a deep discount in our premiums. We have to buy cyber insurance in order to use debit and credit cards. 
Parking was also discussed. Buddy
